Select girl to join him off to the side

She wanted four swans for her betrothal and the messengers had come to collect the swans with the beautiful singing voices.

Just as the messengers began to take the swans...

Messengers begin to get them – kids as swans sitting on their knees

The swans transformed back into children. The curse had been lifted.

The children aged very quickly for they had no more magic to sustain them.

Kids shrink up as if they are very old

Kids stand up; messengers leave

They died at peace, their curse finally lifted. The single gravestone can still be visited to this day in the town of Allihies, County Cork.
