Eire, The <u>Emerald</u> Isle Land of <u>Myths</u> & <u>Legends</u> Follow Along

- Cattle Grazing by Lough Inagh is in the Connemara 1. region, County Galway. It is known for people speaking <u>Gaelic</u>, Ireland's ancient language.
- The River Erriff empties into the <u>sea</u> at Killarney harbor. It is 2. home to endangered It is also home to Atlantic Salmon. A famous legend is the Salmon of Knowledge
- Lower Lough Erne is a <u>lake</u> in County Fermanagh, 3. Northern Ireland. It is the setting of a legend called "The <u>Golden</u> <u>Apples</u> of Lough Erne.
- The Evening Ritual, is a picture of <u>cattle/cows</u> being herded 4. to a new place in Clonmore, County Longford. The name Clonmore means "big meadow".
- The Bastion at Kilkenny is part of the ruins of an old 5. <u>castle</u>. The invading Normans and English built <u>stone</u> castle walls for protection from the Irish.

6.	Curraghmore, meaning "great <u>bog</u> " is the location of an estate. The invading Normand and English would evict the <u>lrish</u> and give the land to others.
7.	Gougane Barra was named after Saint <u>Finbarr</u> . In 1938 a small forest <u>park</u> was created in the valley.
8.	Torc Mountain, meaning "wild <u>boar</u> " in Irish, was the home of the Beaker folk, who were <u>copper</u> miners.
9.	Torc Cascades is a waterfall named for a legend. A man was cursed by the devil to turn into a <u>boar</u> every night. When his secret was discovered, he burst into <u>flames</u> and threw himself into a nearby lough. The water overflowed creating the waterfall.
10.	Sunset Over Inishturk is a painting of small island off the west coast of <u>Ireland</u> . In the 6th century, a monastery was built on the island. Peace was shattered when the <u>Vikings</u> began raiding the coasts.
